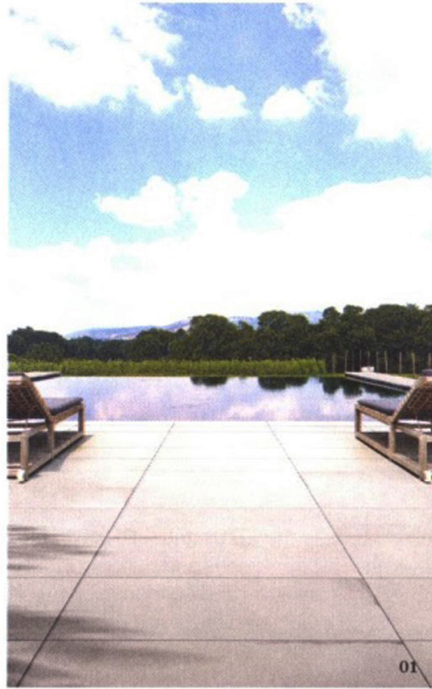

01 FLORIM 2CM OUTDOOR COLLECTION
Whether installed as poolside paving or in hospital corridors, these 0.75-inch porcelain tiles are exceptionally strong and resistant to chemicals, mold, mildew, corrosion, and stains. They are easy to install and remove, and come in a wide range of colors and finishes—the white Visions cement-look finish is shown here. florimusa.com

02 NEMSCHOFF CLASSICS ASPEN ARMCHAIR
In a quest to bring some of the warmth and comfort of residential spaces to institutional settings, Nemschoff dove into its archives to expand its Classics collection. Designed by architect Jürgen Schubert, this versatile workplace LED lighting solution allows direct and indirect lighting to be controlled independently, so users can adjust it to suit their comfort while also saving energy. 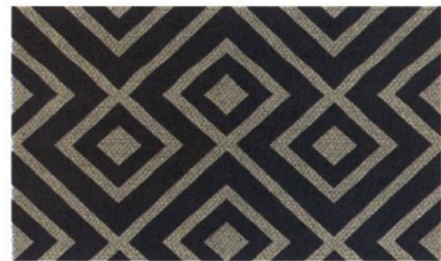


06 PAOLA LENTI PORTOFINO TABLE

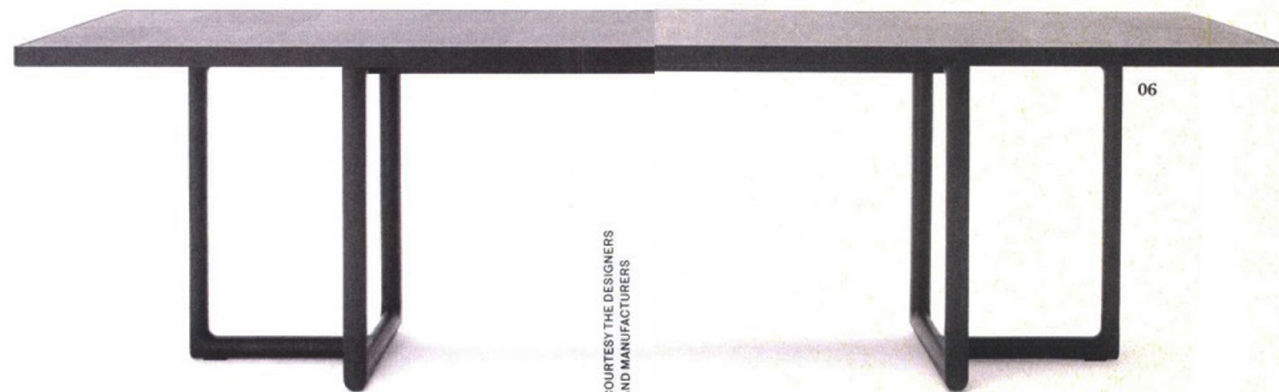
